## Brisbane police pursuit investigated

A police chase that led to a four-car crash, injuries to two innocent motorists and an apparent wrongful arrest is being investigated in Brisbane.

A stolen car being pursued by police ran a red light in Slacks Creek in Brisbane's south around 6.40pm (AEST) and collided with a white sedan.

The sedan smashed into a stationary car and a set of traffic lights before coming to rest on the westbound side of Compton Road.

The stolen car also struck the stationary car and another car waiting at the lights.

The driver of the stolen vehicle fled the scene by hailing a taxi, according to Seven Network.

The television news report said cash and a hand gun were found inside the stolen vehicle.

It said police mistakenly arrested an innocent 18-year-old motorist at the crash site, while the driver of the stolen vehicle got away.

Motorist Chris Robbins said he was tackled by a policeman when he got out of his damaged car.

"He jumped out and grabbed me and put me on the back of his car," Mr Robbins told Network Seven.

The 40-year-old male driver of the white sedan was taken to Logan Hospital with minor head injuries.

A 20-year-old female - who Seven Network said was Mr Robbins' girlfriend - was taken to the same hospital suffering minor chest injuries.

The Queensland Police Service's Ethical Standards Command is investigating the incident.

"The police vehicle was some 200 plus metres away from the intersection when the accident happened," Inspector Ron Barry told reporters.

"The police vehicle was not close to the pursued vehicle."
